Confession and Forgiveness

Loving God, you have made covenant with us and with every living creature.

We often sin and respond with "I'm only human!" And while we say we're sorry sometimes we may not truly mean it or say it half-heartedly. But you, O God, remain faithful to the covenant of steadfast love, even when we struggle to repent, admit we are wrong and despite our human nature – we sin and need forgiveness.
